Purpose

Background

The Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (The Department) require a robust evaluation of the Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme (PSDS) to determine the extent to which it enabled public sector decarbonisation, and its impact on carbon emissions, as well as any impacts on the supply chain. The scope of the evaluation includes consideration of the role of the Low Carbon Skills Fund (LCSF) in supporting the development of heat decarbonisation plans, its role in addressing capacity and capability constraints and how well, or otherwise, it has worked together with the PSDS. Winning Moves Ltd has been contracted by The Department to evaluate the scheme, which is in phase 3 of delivery. We are leading a consortium of other specialists including UCL and CAG consultants for the purpose of this evaluation.

Data controller and data processors

For the purposes of this project:

1. The Department is the data controller
2. Winning Moves Ltd is the data processor
3. CAG is also a data processor. UCL, whilst part of our evaluation team is not required to process any personal data.

Type of data that will be processed

The following categories of personal data will be provided to or processed by Winning Moves Ltd:

- > Simple data: contact names of individuals, e-mail addresses, telephone numbers, job titles, organisation names and details of PSDS / LCSF projects the organisation is involved in
- > Behavioural data: opinions of PSDS / LCSF and how respondents have interacted with PSDS / LCSF.

For clarity, sensitive personal data is not to be processed.

How we get the personal data we process

Most of your personal information is provided through the following ways:

We have obtained your contact details in one of three ways:

1. Your contact details may have been supplied by The Department. This includes contact information for public sector organisations who have participated in the schemes (PSDS and LCSF), those that applied but didn't participate, installers and contractors involved in the delivery of PSDS and LCSF and consultants, organisations and government that support the delivery of the schemes.
2. Your contact details may have been supplied to us by others participating in this research, as organisations who are relevant to approach.
3. Your contact details may have been identified through internet searching or Oscar Research, a database provider, to supplement the above and for public sector organisations that were eligible but did not apply to the PSDS and LCSF schemes.

There will be additional personal data collected through surveying from all those being interviewed, for which explicit consent will be sought.

The legal bases for processing your personal data

1. Where your contact details have been shared with us by the Department: Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), the lawful basis we rely on for processing this information is public task: your contact details were shared with us by The Department as they require us to process your personal data to perform a public task. In this instance, processing of personal information is required in order to effectively evaluate the PSDS scheme. Processing includes the processing of data from public sector organisations who have participated in the scheme.
2. Where your contact details have been shared with us by others participating in this work, or by Oscar Research: Under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR), the lawful basis we rely on for processing this information is legitimate interest. In this instance, personal data is disclosed to GC Insight as a third party as it meets the necessary conditions and tests of legitimate interest and relevance – as the Department has a legitimate interest in effectively evaluating the publicly funded PSDS scheme.
3. The additional personal data we collect during interviewing will be under the lawful basis of consent as explicit consent will be obtained prior to commencing any interview.

How we will use your personal data

- > Interview data (from qualitative and quantitative research) will be anonymised before analysis and before any findings are shared with The Department. For clarity, non-anonymised data is not to be shared with The Department.
- > For quality control purposes: we may telephone you to validate your responses.
- > Provided you have given consent, we may recontact you about follow-up research.
- > Results will be reported back to our client in an anonymised format.

Will we share your personal data?

Your personal data will not be shared with any third parties except our sub-processors who may carry out some of the processing on Winning Moves' behalf, and under Winning Moves control. An example of this might include the service provider who hosts our survey platform, IdSurvey.

Any third party must process the personal information as set out in this Privacy Policy and as permitted by the UK's Data Protection Act/laws.

How we will keep your personal data

Your information will be securely stored. We will protect the confidentiality of your information in accordance with our normal data handling procedures and all legal requirements. We will not use it for any purposes other than those which are set out in this Notice. We are committed to keeping personal data secure and take all reasonable technical and organisational measures to protect personal data from loss, misuse or alteration.

We will hold your personal information on our systems for twelve months following completion of the project (which we anticipate being September 2028). It will only be held for as long as necessary to provide research services to our clients, and will anonymise data where possible, securely deleting personal data associated with it at the earliest possible point.

Where your personal data will be processed

Your data will not be transferred or stored outside the UK or European Economic Area.

Your Rights

Co-operation in research is voluntary at all times regardless of what the research is about or who our client is. You are entitled at any stage to ask that your personal data, or part or all of the record of your survey responses, be destroyed or deleted and we will carry out such a request. This can be requested during the interview itself or afterwards. You have the right to access any personal data that we process relating to you. We may ask for verification of your identity before releasing any information to you.
